Senator Apartments is comprised of 97 single room occupancy units. In addition to providing permanent supportive housing and resident services, the building will incorporate features such as Energy Star appliances, and a plethora of environmentally preferred materials.

100% of the rentable (97) units at Senator Apartments are set aside for **homeless or chronically homeless individuals** who are eligible via the Coordinated Entry System or the Los Angeles County Housing for Health Program. Additionally, 20 of these units are reserved for **veterans** (individuals who served in the military). Potential residents must be income qualified and approved by Skid Row Housing Trust Property Management Company and the City of Los Angeles (or the LA County Department of Health Services)
